

Mrs. Mori's Classroom Policies

A learning environment cannot be established until certain standards are honored.

Students will be expected to be on time, be prepared to learn, be willing to learn, and be courteous, respectful, and act in an appropriate manner.

To be on time, a student should be in his or her assigned seat when the tardy bell rings. You should have any assignments that are due ready to turn in at the beginning of the hour. Please remain in your seat at the end of the class period until dismissed. Please use the restroom and get drinks between classes.

To be prepared to learn, a student must come to class with all the necessary materials, i.e., pencils, pens, binder, assignments, and the correct textbook or novel. A student will not be excused to go to his or her locker to get forgotten materials.

To be willing to learn, a student must give each assignment an honest effort. Those who fail my class have failed to try.

Hopefully, by the time a student has reached high school, he or she has been fully instructed in the do's and don't of classroom behavior. In particular, a student will be expected to be courteous and respectful of others and their property at all times in my classroom. You should be quiet and attentive when someone is speaking.

When you are speaking, foul language or comments that disparage others are not appropriate. Your behavior should be such that it does not create a disruption to anyone in the class or to your own learning. Using electronic devices in class is a bad choice. Cheating is a really bad choice. Please remember that your behavior should not create any extra expense or cleaning for anyone else. Each student will be held accountable to clean up after himself or herself and repair or pay for any damages. Water in clear plastic bottles is allowed in class; food is not allowed.

I trust everyone to behave appropriately, responsibly and respectfully in my class. If there is a problem the administration and your parent/guardian will be contacted.
